- * The cultivation of herbs is practiced first hand in our herb garden located behind an 1860's farmhouse. An assortment of plants are grown, harvested and used in projects throughout the year and field trips to other gardens and nurseries expand our knowledge of varieties and propagation practices.
- * Information about crafting with herbs is shared with projects ranging from household cleaners to potpourris to working with natural dyes.
- * With a growing interest in the medicinal use of herbs, local speakers provide educational information on the healing properties of herbs.
- * Culinary use of herbs is a favorite, with new recipes tested and shared at monthly meetings.
- * Each year we focus on the "Herb of the Year", determined by the International Herb Association, and present an **Herb Day** with vendors, speakers and activities. It provides a fun-filled, educational, event for the community and gives us a chance to network with other herb enthusiasts.
- * Community involvement is important and each year we participate in community outreach programs in the Bay Area and beyond.
